Waiver Control

- A waiver is not necessary. BSC / CTN is not required.

Pre-Shipment Inspection

- Not required

Stringent Procedures on Imports to Juba

The South Sudan customs authorities have been increasing controls on tax exemptions.

- Tax exemption has to be provided to South Sudan authorities 5 days after loading on board.
- One month is necessary before obtaining the official exemption document.
- The POL agent must inform POD and final destination agents when tax exempted cargo (UN cargo, humanitarian shipments, ministries) are loaded, in order that they initiate the procedure.

Cargo that does not comply with this procedure will not be cleared and delivery to consignee delayed with storage surcharges.

Prohibited Imports

Sudan does not apply any quantitative import restrictions. All goods can be imported to Sudan except those, which are prohibited by social values or security considerations.

- Wines
- Narcotics
- Gambling equipment
- Arms and ammunitions.
